1. What is mySATHI?

mySATHI (Scholastic Aptitude Test for Higher Education Institutions) is a global-standard, on-demand, computer-adaptive entrance examination designed to transform undergraduate admissions.

Developed by the mySATHI Foundation and delivered by DEXIT Global across 235 secure test centers worldwide, mySATHI evaluates the 4Cs critical for success in higher education and beyond:

- Critical Thinking
- Creativity
- Collaboration
- Communication

Unlike traditional subject-heavy exams, mySATHI is inclusive, future-ready, and policy-aligned, offering universities deeper insights into student readiness and enabling a fairer, more globally relevant admissions system.

2. How is mySATHI different from other UG entrance exams?

mySATHI distinguishes itself through:

- **On-Demand Access:** Available anytime, from January 1, 2026, across 235 DEXIT Global centers.
 - **Future-Ready Skills:** Focused on higher-order cognitive and human-centric capabilities, not rote memorization.
 - **Inclusive & Equitable:** Stream-neutral, multilingual, affordable, and designed to minimize coaching bias.
 - **Global Benchmarking:** Positioned as India’s alternative to SAT/ACT, adapted for Asia, Africa, and the Middle East, while aligned with NEP 2020.
 - **Developmental Purpose:** Scorecards provide diagnostic feedback for both students and institutions—shifting the exam from a filtering tool to a developmental tool.

3. What is the core ideology of the mySATHI Foundation?

 - Apply it for scholarship selection, diversity recruitment, and international outreach.

5. How often will mySATHI be held?

- On-demand from Day One: Available continuously starting January 1, 2026.
 - Global Network: Delivered across 235 secure DEXIT Global centers.
 - Multiple Attempts: Students can re-take and submit their best scores, eliminating the “bad-day” effect of single-shot exams.

6. What is the structure of mySATHI?

- Format: Computer-adaptive, similar to GRE/GMAT.
- Duration: ~2 hours.
- Question Types: Multiple-choice, scenario-based simulations, case studies, and constructed responses.
- Reporting: Scores presented in performance bands with diagnostic insights (like IELTS), rather than single raw marks.

Domains Measured:

- Cognitive Skills – reasoning, problem-solving, communication.
- 21st-Century Skills – creativity, collaboration, critical thinking, communication.
- Practical Literacies – data interpretation, numeric literacy, reading comprehension.
- Human-Centric Capabilities – ethics, resilience, adaptability, learnability.
- Non-Cognitive Traits – emotional intelligence, tenacity.

 - Academic Year 2026–27 → First cohort admitted using mySATHI scores.
